Lyndon WILLIAMS (Scotland)

Lyndon's involvement in disability badminton started in the early 1990's, and slowly escalated after Welsh Badminton took on the delivery of the 2003 World Championships in Cardiff. He became Vice-President of International Badminton Association for the Disabled (IBAD), before the successful integration into Badminton World Federation (BWF) in 2010.

Lyndon has delivered a number of workshops and conferences over the years focusing on inclusion and the development of Disability Badminton and wrote Badminton England's 'Kicking Up A Racket' resource and has also worked with Sports Coach UK and Disability Sport Scotland in developing information leaflets for a range of sports..

Apart from disability badminton, Lyndon was the European Junior Doubles Champion (1983), Senior European Doubles Bronze medallist (1986) and Doubles World Number 11. He achieved 62 Caps for Wales and won 14 Senior National titles before a back injury ended his career prematurely at 23.

Currently, Lyndon is the Chairman of the Scottish and 4 Nations disability groups, a member of the BWF Para-Badminton Commission and also works as a consultant to Federation of Disability Sports Wales as a case officer, assisting seven sports with their policies and procedures relating to inclusion and disability.
