This change allows BEC to fulfil its obligation to its Members

Notice and Agenda of Annual Delegates' Meeting	-Added BEC responsibility to inform the Membership of the time and location of the Annual Delegates' Meeting and to include details of which positions are up for election and the deadline for sending in proposals in advance of formal notice being circulated	To ensure that this information is provided to MA's well in advance of the deadline for nominations and proposals to allow them to better plan and prepare for the ADM
11. Extraordinary Delegates' Meeting	-Added a timeframe of 4 weeks from when MA's request an Extraordinary Delegates' Meeting until the meeting must be called	To ensure that such request must be dealt with in a timely manner
